61st Senate Minutes

March 28, 2022

Vice President Radicioni called the 21st meeting of the 61st Senate of the MSU Student Association to order at 6:34 pm.

Secretary Schuh proceeded to call roll and determined that quorum was met with 42 Senators present.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 19, he is seconded by Senator Denmark. Senator Heson comes before the 61st Senate. Senator Tate motions to open a hearing for Vineeth Vanga, he is seconded by Senator Guest. Vineeth Vanga comes before the 61st Senate and details and answers questions regarding Resolution 19. Senator Heson motions to close the hearing, he is seconded by Senator Bevon. Senator Denmark motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Bevon. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Resolution 19. With a vote tally of 37 YAY, 5 NAY, and 0 present, Resolution 19 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Act 12, he is seconded by Senator Jones. Senator Jones proceeds to describe this Act in great detail to the 61st Senate. Senator Guest motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Helton. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on the adoption of Act 12. With a vote tally of 41 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Act 12 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 20, he is seconded by Senator Bridges. Senator Heson and Senator Sullivan proceed to describe this resolution to the 61st Senate. Senator Jones motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Miller. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on the adoption of Resolution 20. With a vote tally of 36 YAY, 5 NAY, and 0 present, Resolution 20 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 21, he is seconded by Senator McMinn. Senator Heson and Senator Sullivan proceed to describe this resolution to the 61st Senate. Senator Jones motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Dorsey. Senator Tate motions to suspend the rules and carry out the voting via voice vote, he is seconded by Senator Denmark. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on the adoption of Resolution 21 via voice vote. The Resolution fails and is sent back to committees.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 16, she is seconded by Senator Turner. Senator Steward proceeds to come to the front of the room. Senator Tate motions to open a hearing for Olivia Hanby, and Senator Kamal seconds. Olivia Hanby comes to the front of the room and explains the resolution and answers questions. Upon the conclusion of questions, Senator Heson motions to close the hearing, he is seconded by Senator Donaldson. Senator Tate motions to move into a period of discussion with a time limit of three minutes, he is seconded by Senator Denmark. The Senate votes on the motion via GroupMe poll. With a vote tally of 17 Yay, 21 Nay, and 1 Present, the motion fails. Senator Jones

motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Daniels. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on the adoption of Resolution 16. With a vote tally of 39 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Resolution 16 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 18, he is seconded by Senator Denmark. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Resolution 18. Senator Guest motions to open a hearing for Cooper Word and Izzy Karp, he is seconded by Senator Ray. Upon the conclusion of the hearing, Senator Sullivan motions to close the hearing, he is seconded by Senator Tate. Senator Tate motions to open the floor for discussion, he is seconded by Senator Jones. Senator Helton motions to limit discussion to two minutes, he is seconded by Senator Bevon. When the two minutes of discussion are up, Senator Heson motions to extend discussion by five minutes, he is seconded by Senator Ray. Upon the end of the discussion, Senator Sullivan motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Bridges. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Resolution 18. With a vote tally of 25 YAY, 14 NAY, and 1 present, Resolution 18 passes.

Senator Sweeney motions to adopt Bill 11. She is seconded by Senator Denmark. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 11. When he is finished, Senator Guest motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Helton. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 11. With a vote tally of 40 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bills 11 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Resolution 17, he is seconded by Senator Steward. Senator Nakoom comes before the 61st Senate and explains Resolution 17. When she is finished, Senator Yelverton motions to the previous question, he is seconded by Senator Biggers. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Resolution 18. With a vote tally of 37 YAY, 1 NAY, and 0 present, Resolution 17 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Bill 14, he is seconded by Senator Willis. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 14. When he is finished, Senator McFatter motions to the previous question and is seconded by Senator Timberlake. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 14. With a vote tally of 38 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 14 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Bill 15, he is seconded by Senator Sullivan. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 15. Senator McFatter motions to the previous question and is seconded by Senator Timberlake. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 15. With a vote tally of 38 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 15 passes.

Senator Sweeney motions to adopt Bill 16, she is seconded by Senator Nakoom. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 16. Senator Donaldson motions to the previous question and is seconded by Senator Mayatt. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 16. With a vote tally of 40 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 16 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Bill 12, he is seconded by Senator Biggers. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 12. Senator Hulbert motions to the previous question and is seconded by Senator Ray. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 12. With a vote tally of 39 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 12 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Bill 17, he is seconded by Senator Ray. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 17. When he is finished, Senator Yelverton motions to the previous question

and is seconded by Senator Kamal. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 17. With a vote tally of 38 YAY, 0 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 17 passes.

Senator Tate motions to adopt Bill 13, he is seconded by Senator Guest. Senator Jones comes before the 61st Senate and explains Bill 13. Senator Tate motions to open the floor for discussion and motions to limit the discussion to three minutes, Senator Biggerstaff seconds. After the three-minute discussion ends, Senator Steward motions to the previous question and is seconded by Senator Timberlake. The 61st Senate proceeds to vote on Bill 13. With a vote tally of 38 YAY, 2 NAY, and 0 present, Bill 13 passes.

Seeing no more business on the agenda, Vice President Radicioni entertains a motion to adjourn. Senator Wingerter motions to adjourn, he is seconded by Senator Denmark. The 61st Senate was Adjourned at 9:01 PM.
