

Judicial Council Positions and Expectations

The Judicial branch has been established as the superior court of the Mississippi State Student Association. The students who are selected serve permanently. During their term, the members of the Judicial Branch are to be experts on the interpretation of the Mississippi State Student Association Constitution. They will work to ensure both the Senate and Executive Branches adhere to said Constitution and bylaws, as well as University policy.

The Judicial Council is to be comprised of at least 15 members representing each of the four years of undergraduate students and those in graduate school. Applications are open to Freshman during their first fall semester. Applications may also be opened as positions on the council become available in the case of resignation. This is to ensure that each student cohort is adequately represented. There are three governing positions of the Judicial Branch, they are:

Chief Justice

The SA Chief Justice shall preside over the SA Judicial Council and shall be responsible for making any appointments within the council.

Vice Chief Justice

The SA Vice Chief Justice shall fulfill the duties of the SA Chief Justice in their absence or incapacity and shall fulfill other duties as directed by the SA Chief Justice.

Elections Commissioner

The SA Elections Commissioner shall have authority over the administration of SA elections.
